Remember to put all recyclables into your bin loose, never bagged in plastic sacks. Plastic grocery sacks and plastic film cause jams and equipment problems as material is sorted over conveyors, screens and metal moving parts.

Pre-Sort Conveyor

This area is called the Pre-sort Conveyor. This is where our hard-working employees remove contaminants and items that are not supposed to be recycled, such as oversized, bulky plastic items and bagged trash. It is critical step to prevent other problems or damage to the system down the line.
